**II Critical Reading Skills**

**Analysis** Definition Breaking down a text into its component parts to understand its structure purpose and meaning Importance Analysis allows students to identify the main ideas supporting arguments and authors perspective Strategies Identifying the text structure Recognize patterns such as causeandeffect compareand contrast or problemsolution Analyzing authors
