in industrialized cultures what we do to earn a living is usually divorced from what we do the rest of the time this contrasts with non market cultures where work is an intimate part of life people of such cultures perceive a unity between hunting and raising a family between making pots and training children between the building of houses and the practice of religion often there is no separate word for work because work is such an all encompassing activity work in non market and transitional societies is an overview of the organization of work in diverse societies the division of labor the notions of time that affect work and working and the kinds of adaptations people make when transplanted from one society to another the groundbreaking study encompasses pre industrial and non market societies as well as cultures in the process of change and modernization this double focus provides an unusual and stimulating perspective for both anthropology and the social sciences this book features a broad theoretical introduction delineating the major issues and aspects of investigation in this field it then presents twenty essays that show how work is carried on by women and men in varied societies and cultures the authors provide guidelines for understanding the different value systems and discuss why each approach to work is appropriate in its specific societal structure

since the emergence of religious studies and the social sciences as academic disciplines the concept of magic has played a major role in defining religion and in mediating the relation of religion to science across these disciplines magic has regularly been configured as a definitively non modern phenomenon juxtaposed to distinctly modern models of religion and science yet this notion of magic has remained stubbornly amorphous in making magic randall styers seeks to account for the extraordinary vitality of scholarly discourse purporting to define and explain magic despite its failure to do just that he argues that this persistence can best be explained in light of the western drive to establish and secure distinctive norms for modern identity norms based on narrow forms of instrumental rationality industrious labor rigidly defined sexual roles and the containment of wayward forms of desire magic has served to designate a form of alterity or deviance against which dominant western notions of appropriate religious piety legitimate scientific rationality and orderly social relations are brought into relief scholars have found magic an invaluable tool in their efforts to define the appropriate boundaries of religion and science on a broader level says styers magical thinking has served as an important foil for modernity itself debates over the nature of magic have offered a particularly rich site at which scholars have worked to define and to contest the nature of modernity and norms for life in the modern world

magic has been an important term in western history and continues to be an essential topic in the modern academic study of religion anthropology sociology and cultural history defining magic is the first volume to assemble key texts that aim at determining the nature of magic establish its boundaries and key features and explain its working the reader brings together

as part of papua new guinea the trobriant islands are located in a bordering sea of the pacific ocean at the beginning of the 20th century the anthropologist bronislaw malinowski was one of the first to explore the archipelago in the south sea and its inhabitants in the context of his work he discovered that freud's psychoanalytic universality thesis regarding the oedipus

complex is not true for the islanders in this first volume out of three malinowsky deals with the tribal economics and social organizations as well as the trobriandan gardening techniques and the magic within this kind of work

the editor hopes that these papers on themes of interest to morton smith will contribute to the critical discussion of some problems of concern to him since smith is one of the great scholarly masters of this generation it is through scholarship and not through encomia that the editor and his colleagues choose to pay their tribute the facts about the man his writings his critical judgment intelligence erudition and wit his labor as selfless teacher and objective profound critic speak for themselves and require no embellishment i hope that the quality of what follows will impress my teacher professor morton smith and those scholars who care to read these volumes as having been worth the immense efforts of all concerned from the foreword by jacob neusner

this volume contains a series of provocative essays that explore expressions of magic and ritual power in the ancient world the essays are authored by leading scholars in the fields of egyptology ancient near eastern studies the hebrew bible judaica classical greek and roman studies early christianity and patristics and coptic and islamic egypt the strength of the present volume lies in the breadth of scholarly approaches represented the book begins with several papyrological studies presenting important new texts in greek and coptic continuing with essays focusing on taxonomy and definition the concluding essays apply contemporary theories to analyses of specific test cases in a broad variety of ancient mediterranean cultures

this book provides a thorough survey and analysis of the emergence and functions of written culture in rus covering roughly the modern east slav lands of european russia ukraine and belarus part i introduces the full range of types of writing the scripts and languages the materials the social and physical contexts ranging from builders scratches on bricks through to luxurious parchment manuscripts part ii presents a series of thematic studies of the socio cultural dynamics of writing in order to reveal and explain distinctive features in the rus assimilation of the technology the comparative approach means that the book may also serve as a case study for those with a broader interest either in medieval uses of writing or in the social and cultural history of information technologies overall the impressive scholarship and idiosyncratic wit of this volume commend it to students and specialists in russian history and literature alike awarded the alec nove prize given by the british association for slavonic and east european studies for the best book of 2002 in russian soviet or post soviet studies
