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millar provides a clear and comprehensible narrative a coherent and accurate synthesis intended as a guide for students and the general reader to an extremely complex period in british history his aim is to help readers avoid getting lost in a maze of

detail and rather to maintain a grasp of the big picture although the english civil war is usually seen in england at least as a conflict between two sides it involved the scots the irish and the army and the people of england especially london at some points events occurred and perspectives changed with such disorienting rapidity that even those who lived through these events were confused as to where they stood in relation to one another as the 1640s wore on events unfolded in ways which the participants had not expected and in many cases did not want hindsight might suggest that everything led logically to the trial and execution of the king but these were in fact highly improbable outcomes since the 1980s a three kingdoms approach has become almost compulsory but miller s focus is unashamedly on england events in scotland and ireland are covered only insofar as they had an impact on events in england

a brilliant appraisal of the civil war and its long term consequences by an acclaimed historian the political upheaval of the mid seventeenth century has no parallel in english history other events have changed the occupancy and the powers of the throne but the conflict of 1640 60 was more dramatic the monarchy and the house of lords were abolished to be replaced by a republic and military rule in this wonderfully readable account blair worden explores the events of this period and their origins the war between king and parliament the execution of charles i cromwell s rule and the restoration while aiming to reveal something more elusive the motivations of contemporaries on both sides and the concerns of later generations

remembering the english civil wars is the first collection of essays to explore how the bloody struggle which took place between the supporters of king and parliament during the 1640s was viewed in retrospect the english civil wars were perhaps the most calamitous series of conflicts in the country s recorded history over the past twenty years there has been a surge of interest in the way that the civil wars were remembered by the men women and children who were unfortunate enough to live through them the essays brought together in this book not only provide a clear and accessible introduction to this fast developing field of study but also bring together the voices of a diverse group of scholars who are working at its cutting edge through the investigation of a broad but closely interrelated range of topics including elite popular urban and local memories of the wars as well as the relationships between civil war memory and ceremony material culture and concepts of space and

place the essays contained in this volume demonstrate with exceptional vividness and clarity how the people of england and wales continued to be haunted by the ghosts of the mid century conflict throughout the decades which followed the book will be essential reading for all students of the english civil wars stuart britain and the history of memory

the english civil war is a joy to behold a thing of beauty this will be the civil war atlas against which all others will judged and the battle maps in particular will quickly become the benchmark for all future civil war maps professor martyn bennett department of history languages and global studies nottingham trent university the english civil wars 1638 51 comprised the deadliest conflict ever fought on british soil in which brother took up arms against brother father fought against son and towns cities and villages fortified themselves in the cause of royalists or parliamentarians although much historical attention has focused on the events in england and the key battles of edgehill marston moor and naseby this was a conflict that engulfed the entirety of the three kingdoms and led to a trial and execution that profoundly shaped the british monarchy and parliament this beautifully presented atlas tells the whole story of britain s revolutionary civil war from the earliest skirmishes of the bishops wars in 1639 40 through to 1651 when charles ii s defeat at worcester crushed the royalist cause leading to a decade of stuart exile each map is supported by a detailed text providing a complete explanation of the complex and fluctuating conflict that ultimately meant that the crown would always be answerable to parliament

the civil war fought between charles i and his parliament is one of the most momentous conflicts in english history this book provides a wholly new perspective by revealing the extent to which the struggle possessed an ethnic dimension and the impact of that on the forging of english national identity stoye reveals the acute fear of foreign invasion that gripped england after 1640 when the insular english were placed on the brink of what they perceived as a national emergency stoye sets the creation of the new model army within that context arguing that its appearance represented the culmination of a campaign by oliver cromwell and others to forge a purely english military instrument one purged of the foreign solders who had been so prominent in earlier parliamentary armies this self consciously english army eventually succeeded in wresting back control of the kingdom by defeating the king s forces re conquering cornwall and wales and expelling all foreign agents

this popular history of the english civil war tells the story of the bloody conflict between oliver cromwell and charles i from the perspectives of those involved

james i and vi bequeathed his son a reasonably peaceful land in 1625 yet over a decade later charles i s kingdoms erupted one by one into open rebellion this book explores how this came to be david j appleby explains how interconnected conflicts arose in the three kingdoms and how they gave rise to a revolution which swept away the institution of monarchy and the house of lords this book shows how the embryonic english republic s need to counter domestic resistance and international threats caused the fighting to spread to the channel islands the caribbean and the american colonies combining his expertise of the stuart monarchy and post conflict culture with a fresh and accessible tone appleby unravels why the memory of this conflict remains culturally and politically relevant and hotly contested to this day

the english civil war was a series of armed conflicts and political upheavals which spanned the british isles in the mid seventeenth century it was fought on a wide range of religious political and racial issues and succeeded in dividing the traditional loyalties of class friendship and family ties within all four kingdoms this unprecedented period of disruption resulted in far reaching political revolution the re evaluation of political representation and social structure and ultimately laid the foundations of the british constitution we know today in the english civil war martyn bennett introduces the reader to the main

debates surrounding the civil war from the st giles riots in edinburgh in 1637 to the restoration of charles ii in may 1660 complete with biographies of the key personalities and descriptions of events battles and military institutions bennett covers the run up to the conflict the wars themselves and the aftermath this comprehensive a z companion to the history of the civil wars provides all the facts and figures that an armchair general would ever need

one of the most dramatic periods in english history was that of the civil wars fought throughout the country in the mid 17th century the population was split down the middle while many peers and gentry took the side of the king others equally supported the leaders of parliament so families and friends were painfully divided in their loyalties the final defeat trial and execution of king charles i shock the monarchies throughout europe but left them deeply impressed by the victories of oliver cromwell and by his seizure of power as lord protector

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the destruction caused by the english civil wars was widespread and devastating towns villages churches and country houses were destroyed and by the end of the second civil war at least 150 towns and 50 villages had suffered some damage 200 country houses were ruined and more than 50 000 people had been made homeless stephen porter s detailed study of this aspect of the impact of the civil war is based upon research in archives and libraries across the country and his conclusions have been accepted as an important contribution to our understanding of it he describes the reasons for the

destruction and the relations between soldiers and civilians and vividly conveys the feelings of those caught up by the traumatic events of the war

the year 1642 witnessed the outbreak of the first english civil war which saw royalist troops loyal to king charles fight the parliamentarians in several major battles and many sieges peter young explores the tactics equipment and organisation of the armies of both sides drawing a compelling picture of what it must have been like for the men who lived and fought in england over 350 years ago chapters on fighting cavalry infantry artillery and discipline examine the subject in depth with many contemporary accounts such as those of royalist captain richard atkyns who served in one of the most active regiments of the war

sir god hath taken away your eldest son by a cannon shot it brake his leg we were necessitated to have it cut off whereof he died in one of the most famous and moving letters of the civil war oliver cromwell told his brother in law that on 2 july 1644 parliament had won an emphatic victory over a royalist army commanded by king charles i s nephew prince rupert on rolling moorland west of york but that battle marston moor had also slain his own nephew the recipient s firstborn in this vividly narrated history of the deadly conflict that engulfed the nation during the 1640s peter gaunt shows that with the exception of world war i the death rate was higher than any other contest in which britain has participated numerous towns and villages were garrisoned attacked damaged or wrecked the landscape was profoundly altered yet amidst all the blood and killing the fighting was also a catalyst for profound social change and innovation charting major battles raids and engagements the author uses rich contemporary accounts to explore the life changing experience of war for those involved whether musketeers at cheriton dragoons at edgehill or cromwell s disciplined ironsides at naseby 1645

a military history of the english civil war examines how the civil war was won who fought for whom and why it ended with a straightforward style and clear chronology that enables readers to make their own judgements and pursue their own interests further this original history provides a thorough critique of the reasons that have been cited for parliament s victory and the

king's defeat in 1645-46 it discusses the strategic options of the parliamentary and royalist commanders and councils of war and analyses the decisions they made arguing that the king's faulty command structure was more responsible for his defeat than Sir Thomas Fairfax's strategic flair it also argues that the way that resources were used rather than the resources themselves explain why the war ended when it did

a brilliantly researched and vividly written history of the English Civil Wars from one of Britain's most prominent civil war historians the sequence of civil wars that ripped England apart in the seventeenth century was the single most traumatic event in this country between the medieval Black Death and the two world wars indeed it is likely that a greater percentage of the population were killed in the civil wars than in the first world war this sense of overwhelming trauma gives this major new history its title God's Fury England's Fire the name of a pamphlet written after the king's surrender it sums up the widespread feeling within England that the seemingly endless nightmare that had destroyed families towns and livelihoods was ordained by a vengeful God that the people of England had sinned and were now being punished as with all civil wars however God's Fury could support or destroy either side in the conflict was God angry at Charles I for failing to support the true Protestant religion and refusing to work with parliament or was God angry with those who had dared challenge his anointed sovereign Michael Braddick's remarkable book gives the reader a vivid and enduring sense both of what it was like to live through events of uncontrollable violence and what really animated the different sides God's Fury England's Fire allows readers to understand once more the events that have so fundamentally marked this country and which still resonate centuries after their bloody ending

a king beheaded a monarchy abolished and a commoner leading a republic by military rule set in their place the wars that tore through the country in the mid-seventeenth century splitting government communities and families alike were a true watershed in English history but how with Queen Elizabeth I's Golden Age still in living memory did such a situation arise exploring the period's political disputes religious conflicts and military battles Patrick Little scrutinizes the nature and practicalities of conducting a civil war on English soil as well as the experiences and motivations of key factions and

combatants by assessing how the realities of life in England shaped the conflict and were torn apart by it. This wonderfully readable beginner's guide gets to the very heart of how a people came to kill their king.

The English Civil War pitted parliament against the crown following a breakdown in their relationship ultimately caused by a struggle over power, religion, and control. The civil war split the country and resulted in the execution of Charles I and the exile of his son, and the English monarchy was replaced first by the Commonwealth of England and then the Protectorate. Oliver Cromwell dominated the politics of the new rule and still divides opinion today with some seeing him as a brutal dictator and others seeing him as a hero of liberty. *The English Civil War in 100 Facts* examines the twenty years of intermittent warfare covering the first, second, and third wars from the initial conflict with Charles I to the fight of Charles II's supporters with the Rump Parliament. Dr. Andrew Lacey guides us through some of the key figures and their stories as well as some of the key battles and politics in this period that drastically altered the structure of English rule.

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
