between world war i and world war ii african americans quest for civil rights took on a more aggressive character as a new group of black activists challenged the politics of civility traditionally embraced by old guard leaders in favor of a more forceful protest strategy beth tompkins bates traces the rise of this new protest politics which was grounded in making demands and backing them up with collective action by focusing on the struggle of the brotherhood of sleeping car porters bscp to form a union in chicago headquarters of the pullman company bates shows how the bscp overcame initial opposition from most of chicago s black leaders by linking its union message with the broader social movement for racial equality as members of bscp protest networks mobilized the black community around the quest for manhood rights and economic freedom they broke down resistance to organized labor even as they expanded the boundaries of citizenship to include equal economic opportunity by the mid 1930s bscp protest networks gained platforms at the national level fusing brotherhood activities first with those of the national negro congress and later with the march on washington movement lessons learned during this era guided the next generation of activists who carried the black freedom struggle forward after world war ii

as nathan huggins once stated altering american history to account fully for the nation s black voices would change the tone and meaning the frame and the substance of the entire story rather than a sort of pilgrim s progress tale of bold ascent and triumph american history with the black parts told in full would be transmuted into an existential tragedy closer huggins said to sartre s no exit than to the vision of life in bunyan the relation between memory and history has received increasing attention both from historians and from literary critics in this volume a group of leading scholars has come together to examine the role of historical consciousness and imagination in african american culture the result is a complex picture of the dynamic ways in which african

american historical identity constantly invents and transmits itself in literature art oral documents and performances each of the scholars represented has chosen a different site of memory from a variety of historical and geographical points and from different ideological theoretical and artistic perspectives yet the book is unified by a common concern with the construction of an emerging african american cultural memory the renowned group of contributors including hazel carby werner sollors vicki clark catherine clinton and nellie mckay among others consists of participants of the five year series of conferences at the dubois institute at harvard university from which this collection originated conducted under the leadership of genevieve fabre melvin dixon and nathan huggins the conferences and as a result this book represent something of a cultural moment themselves and scholars and students of american and african american literature and history will be richer as a result

from one of our most distinguished historians a new examination of the vitally important years of emancipation and reconstruction during and immediately following the civil war a necessary reconsideration that emphasizes the era's political and cultural meaning for today's america in *Forever Free* eric foner overturns numerous assumptions growing out of the traditional understanding of the period which is based almost exclusively on white sources and shaped by often unconscious racism he presents the period as a time of determination especially on the part of recently emancipated black americans to put into effect the principles of equal rights and citizenship for all drawing on a wide range of long neglected documents he places a new emphasis on the centrality of the black experience to an understanding of the era we see african americans as active agents in overthrowing slavery in helping win the civil war and even more actively in shaping reconstruction and creating a legacy long obscured and misunderstood foner makes clear how by war's end freed slaves in the south built on networks of church and family in order to exercise their right of suffrage as well as gain access to education land and employment he shows us that the birth of the ku klux klan and renewed acts of racial violence were retaliation for the progress made by blacks soon after the war he refutes lingering misconceptions about reconstruction including the attribution of its ills to corrupt african american politicians and carpetbaggers and connects it to the movements for civil rights and racial justice joshua brown's illustrated commentary on the era's graphic art and photographs complements the narrative he offers a unique portrait of how americans envisioned their world and time *Forever Free* is an essential contribution to our understanding of the events that fundamentally reshaped american life after the civil war a persuasive reading of history that transforms our sense of the era from a time of failure and

era produced by the valentine museum in richmond virginia and the virginia historical society the exhibit included a remarkable collection of engravings from harper s weekly lithographs and political cartoons as well as objects such as sculptures rifles flags quilts and other artifacts an important tool for deepening the experience of those who visited the exhibit america s reconstruction also makes this rich assemblage of information and period art available to the wider audience of people unable to see the exhibit in its host cities a work that stands along as well as in proud accompaniment to the temporary collection it will appeal to general readers and assist instructors of both new and seasoned students of the civil war and its tumultuous aftermath
