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history of slavery tells the story of the development of slavery describing the trans atlantic trade that brought 11 million slaves from africa to the americas in the course of 300 years and reviews the life of the slaves under the forcible subjugation and exploitation by other human beings in strictly objective terms this book deals with the historical controversies that have surrounded the study of slavery illustrated with over 300 pictures including 40 in full color drawn from archives around the world to highlight vital facets of the subject it also includes eyewitness accounts and other documentary evidence that complement the text the book also traces the history of the abolition movement beginning in eighteenth century england one of the prime moves in establishing the slave trade in the fifteenth and sixteenth centuries this humanitarian philosophy is now taken for granted at least officially by every nation on earth the author susanne everett also reviews those societies that did not readily accept abolition the arabs who ravaged east africa for slaves until well into this century the belgians who initiated a reign of terror in the congo in the late nineteenth century and the southerners who struggled to preserve their dominant position through the confrontations of civil rights the book concludes with a reminder that slavery remains a vital issue today slave labor was imposed by the russians and germans during the second world war and there are isolated instances in south america and parts of africa that require continued policing by anti slavery commission of the united nations history of slavery is a comprehensive thoroughly illustrated account of human bondage and an essential volume for everyone concerned with society and man s part in it

a thought provoking and important book that raises essential issues crucial not only for understanding our past but also the present day in this panoramic history jeremy black tells how slavery was first developed in the ancient world and reaches all the way to the present in the form of contemporary crimes such as

trafficking and bonded labour he shows how slavery has taken many forms throughout history and across the world from the uprising of spartacus the plantations of the west indies and the murderous forced labour of the gulags and concentration camps slavery helped to consolidate transoceanic empires and helped mould new world societies such as america and brazil black charts the long fight for abolition in the nineteenth century looking at both the campaigners as well as the harrowing accounts of the enslaved themselves slavery is still with us today and coerced labour can be found closer to home than one might expect

exploring the major historiographical theoretical and methodological approaches that have shaped studies on slavery this addition to the writing history series highlights the varied ways that historians have approached the fluid and complex systems of human bondage domination and exploitation that have developed in societies across the world the first part examines more recent attempts to place slavery in a global context touching on contexts such as religion empire and capitalism in its second part the book looks closely at the key themes and methods that emerge as historians reckon with the dynamics of historical slavery these range from politics economics and quantitative analyses to race and gender to pyschohistory history from below and many more throughout examples of slavery and its impact are considered across time and place in ancient greece and rome medieval europe colonial asia africa and the americas and trades throughout the atlantic and indian oceans also taken into account are thinkers from antiquity to the 20th century and the impact their ideas have had on the subject and the debates that follow this book is essential reading for students and scholars at all levels who are interested in not only the history of slavery but in how that history has come to be written and how its debates have been framed across civilizations

eminent scholars provide an overview of what we now know about slavery as an institution and way of life in cultures around the globe from ancient times to the present day drawing on the virtual explosion of empirical research and theoretical discussion of the subject over the past thirty years many of the articles overturn conventional wisdom and illuminate little known aspects of the subject with essays on topics such as concubinage eunuchs and occupational mobility

slavery and coerced labor have been among the most ubiquitous of human institutions both in time from ancient times to the present and in place having existed in virtually all geographic areas and societies this volume covers the period from the independence of haiti to modern perceptions of slavery by assembling

twenty eight original essays each written by scholars acknowledged as leaders in their respective fields issues discussed include the sources of slaves the slave trade the social and economic functioning of slave societies the responses of slaves to enslavement efforts to abolish slavery continuing to the present day the flow of contract labor and other forms of labor control in the aftermath of abolition and the various forms of coerced labor that emerged in the twentieth century under totalitarian regimes and colonialism

this history of african slavery from the fifteenth to the early twentieth centuries examines how indigenous african slavery developed within an international context paul e lovejoy discusses the medieval islamic slave trade and the atlantic trade as well as the enslavement process and the marketing of slaves he considers the impact of european abolition and assesses slavery s role in african history the book corrects the accepted interpretation that african slavery was mild and resulted in the slaves assimilation instead slaves were used extensively in production although the exploitation methods and the relationships to world markets differed from those in the americas nevertheless slavery in africa like slavery in the americas developed from its position on the periphery of capitalist europe this new edition revises all statistical material on the slave trade demography and incorporates recent research and an updated bibliography

from before the days of moses up through the 1960s slavery was a fact of life in the middle east pagans jews christians and muslims bought and sold at the slave markets for millennia trading the human plunder of wars and slave raids that reached from the russian steppes to the african jungles but if the middle east was one of the last regions to renounce slavery how do we account for its and especially islam s image of racial harmony how did these long years of slavery affect racial relations in race and slavery in the middle east bernard lewis explores these questions and others examining the history of slavery in law social thought and practice over the last two millennia with 24 rare and intriguing full color illustrations this fascinating study describes the middle east s culture of slavery and the evolution of racial prejudice lewis demonstrates how nineteenth century europeans mythologized the region as a racial utopia in debating american slavery islam in fact clearly teaches non discrimination but lewis shows that prejudice often won out over pious sentiments as he examines how africans were treated depicted and thought of from antiquity to the twentieth century if my color were pink women would love me but the lord has marred me with blackness lamented a black slave poet in arabia over a millennium ago and lewis deftly draws from these lines and others the nuances of racial relations over time islam he finds restricted enslavement and greatly improved the lot of slaves who included until the early twentieth century some whites while blacks occasionally rose to power and renown but abuses

ring throughout the written and visual record from the horrors of capture to the castration and high mortality which along with other causes have left few blacks in many middle eastern lands despite centuries of importing african slaves race and slavery in the middle east illuminates the legacy of slavery in the region where it lasted longest from the days of warrior slaves and palace eunuchs and concubines to the final drive for abolition illustrated with outstanding reproductions of striking artwork it casts a new light on this critical part of the world and on the nature and interrelation of slavery and racial prejudice

correlation between race and identity the meanings contained in family and community relationships gender and life's commonplaces and the literary and legal representations that legitimated and codified enslavement and difference such themes signal methodological and pedagogical shifts in the field away from master slave or white black race relations models toward perspectives that give us deeper access to the mental universe of slavery topics of the essays range widely including European ideas about the reproductive capacities of African women and the process of making race in the Atlantic world the contradictions of the assimilation of enslaved African American runaways into Creek communities the consequences and meanings of death to Jamaican slaves and slave owners and the tensions between midwifery as a black cultural and spiritual institution and slave midwives as health workers in a plantation economy opening our eyes to the personal the contentious and even the intimate these essays call for a history in which both enslaved and enslavers acted in a vast human drama of bondage and freedom salvation and damnation wealth and exploitation
