geriatrics is one of the fastest growing populations in our nation yet there are not enough nurses to accommodate this growth according to the world health organization over the next forty years the population of adults 60 years and older will triple from 600 million to 2 billion in the past decade there has been an increase in people living longer with multiple complex conditions these people require specialized care by nurses who understand the complexity of their conditions according to the hartford foundation of the 2 56 million nurses approximately 15 000 nurses are gerontological certified john a hartford foundation 2001 annual report 2001 the purpose of this study is to examine further causes of why a shortage remains in gerontological nursing by taking a look at the experience of novice nurses through a quantitative research study the principle investigator evaluated the experience of newly graduated nurses to determine why they did or did not pursue geriatric nursing in order to assess the novice nurses experience a survey was created as an instrumental tool specific factors that may have influenced novice nurses decision to pursue geriatrics were evaluated being a care provider or living with older adults the geriatric content in nursing programs faculty and clinical mentors encouragement toward a career in geriatrics and the senior preceptorship the findings did not show any association between these variables and their decision to pursue geriatrics however this study did conclude further research is necessary to understand the influence clinical mentors and clinical senior preceptorship has on a novice nurse

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
