there are relatively few accessible studies of the precise dynamics of emotion in the athenian theatre in greek tragedy and the emotions first published in 1993 w b stanford reviews the evidence for emotionalism as the great attic playwrights presented it as the actors and choruses expressed it and as their audiences reacted to it greek terms are transliterated and all quotations are in translation so it will appeal particularly to those unfamiliar with classical greek

emotion oriented systems the affective computing domain term coined by rosalind picard in 1997 gathers several scientific areas such as computer science cognitive science psychology design and art the humane machine interaction systems are no longer solely fast and efficient they aim to offer to users affective experiences user s affective state is detected and considered within the interaction the system displays affective state it can reason about their implication to achieve a task or resolve a problem in this book we have chosen to cover various domains of research in emotion oriented systems our aim is also to highlight the importance to base the computational model on theoretical foundations and on natural data

philosophical theories of emotions and to an extent some theories of scientific psychology represent attempts to capture the essence of emotions basically as they are conceived in common sense psychology although there are problems the success of explanations of our behavior in terms of believes desires and emotions creates a presumption that at some level of abstraction they reflect important elements in our psychological nature it is incumbent on a theory of emotions to provide an account of two salient facts about emotions as conceived in common sense psychology as intentional states emotions have representational and rational properties emotions represent states of affairs and they are rationally related to other mental representations figure in rational explanations of behavior and are open to rational assessment emotions also have a close relationship to a range of non intentional phenomena in typical cases emotions involve physiological changes usually associated with the activation of the autonomic nervous system which are proprioceptively experienced and they often involve behavioral tendencies as well

this book is an ideal introduction to work in psychology and the neurosciences walking us through the key topics including historical developmental and cultural perspectives the book shows that the different types of emotions each is an evolved adaptive structure that serves a functional purpose it is shown how these types are expressed differently on the human face how they are developed in the child and how they influence and are influenced by culture health and the ways persons think and perceive knowledge of emotions is essential for anyone who plans to work or whose work already involves helping instructing negotiating or controlling others this introductory level book teaches undergraduates as well as general readers the main components and methods and helps readers to better understand how emotions operate both within the body and out in the world it is a valuable resource for undergraduate students in psychology nursing social work physiotherapy and occupational therapy find this book an important accompaniment

one of the most influential variables in human development is social relationships cultivating emotional intelligence the 5 habits of the emotion coach centers on how educators may build and use positive relationships with their students to help them grow in emotional intelligence additionally this book seeks to answer the question what is the end goal of growing emotionally intelligent students is it a matter of understanding oneself and other s emotions or is the goal simply to produce good citizens as humans we desire connection with others and while most connections remain surface level this book investigates how teachers can make a deeper connection with students for the purpose of growing emotional intelligence and teaching positive social skills if educators are going to do so it will be necessary to reframe traditional school practices that focus on promoting positive behaviors through a discipline system based upon consequences that fail to address the behavior in a redemptive manner

this advanced introduction establishes the study of peace processes as part of the mainstream of sociology a position consistent with the new moral re enchantment of the social sciences it advances a sociological view of peace that goes beyond vague notions of reconciliation to constitute the restoration of moral sensibility from which flows social solidarity sociability and social justice these concepts form the basis for a moral framework outlining what peace means sociologically

actors and actresses play characters such as the embittered medea or the lovelorn romeo or the grieving and tearful hecate the theatre audience holds its breath and then sparks begin to fly but what about the actor has he been affected by the emotions of the character he is playing what sgoing on inside his mind the styling of emotions in the theatre has been the subject of heated debate for centuries in fact diderot in his *paradoxe sur le comedien* insisted that most brilliant actors do not feel anything onstage this greatly resembles the detached acting style associated with

bertolt brecht which in turn stands in direct opposition to the notion of the empathy oriented emotional reality of the actor which is most famously associated with the american actingstyle known as method acting the book s survey of the various dominant acting styles is followed by an analysis of the current state of affairs regarding the psychology of emotions by uniting the psychology of emotions with contemporary acting theories the author is able to come to the conclusion that traditional acting theories are no longer valid for today s actor acting emotions throws new light on the age old issue of double consciousness the paradox of the actor who must nightly express emotions while creating the illusion of spontaneity in addition the book bridges the gap between theory and practice by virtue of the author s large scale field study of the emotions of professional actors in acting emotions the responses of dutch and flemish actors is further supplemented by the responses of a good number of american actors the book offers a unique view of how actors act out emotions and how this acting out is intimately linked to the development of contemporary theatre

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
