daniel stevens analyses the use of the language of divine commitment in the epistle to the hebrews arguing that the author distinguishes promise from the cultic language of covenant to sketch a unique mixture of continuity and discontinuity among the people of god across time stevens stresses through an exegesis of relevant passages that rest is not the primary content of promise nor is it the primary lens through which the other instances of promise language should be understood suggesting instead that the promise is most closely associated with the benefits promised to abraham and then mediated through the various subsequent covenants he further explores how the divine promise relates to both the old and new covenants arguing that hebrews develops a view of salvation history in which covenants are founded upon promises and then bring those promises to fruition by demonstrating the ways in which this understanding of promise sheds light on the author s hermeneutic and on his method of achieving his hortatory purposes for the epistle stevens concludes in a reassertion of the consistency of the author s thought regarding promise

this volume has 1 and 2 corinthians as its main focus where the various contributors address significant aspects of text language background theology and exegesis the first part of the volume deals with the issues of textual criticism and traditions available to paul while the second section is interdisciplinary in nature and integrates different methodologies such as social scientific and rhetorical criticism in order to provide new insights into the text the third and longest section addresses the varied theological problems which the community raised with paul including sexual matters the timing of the resurrection the resurrection body authority and headship soteriology and the question of paul s faithfulness and integrity the final section concentrates on the identity of paul s opponents his visions and apologetics

in the study of christian eschatological thought virtually no attention has been given to past interpretations of the biblical phrase the new heavens and earth john duff uncovers the interpretations of this phrase that were extant in seventeenth century england these interpretations fall into two basic camps those that understood the phrase metaphorically and those that understood the phrase literally some english divines believed the new heavens and earth referred to the new age of the gospel that commenced in the first century ce at that time god flung open the doors of salvation to gentiles while at the same time bringing judgment to the jewish nation for its failure to recognize and embrace jesus as messiah this epic transition was fittingly described as a new heavens and earth a second group of english interpreters believed the phrase stood for a yet future time when the political and religious circumstances of the world would change for the betterment of the church for one thousand years the new heavens and earth stood for a future millennium in which christ would establish his reign over the world prior to the day of resurrection and final judgment theologians who accepted a literal understanding believed the new heavens and earth described the renovation of the physical creation at the final judgment among this group differences of opinion existed with respect to how much of the world would need cleansing what creatures would be restored and of what use would a renovated world serve the idea that the earth and not heaven would be the final abode of the saints emerged among a few obscure writers
