retreats academic writing is one of the most demanding tasks that all academics and researchers face in some disciplines there is guidance on what is needed to be productive successful writers but in other disciplines there is no training support or mentoring of any kind this book helps those in both groups not only to improve their writing skills and strategies but equally importantly to find satisfaction in engaging in regular and productive writing underpinned by a diverse range of literature this book addresses the different dimensions of writing the fresh approach that murray and moore explore in this book includes developing rhetorical knowledge focusing on writing behaviours and understanding writing contexts this book will help writers in academic contexts to develop a productive writing strategy not only for research monitoring exercises but also for the long term
