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a guide to psychedelics and buddhist practice presents guidance and techniques for buddhists who wish to incorporate psychedelics into their practice as well as for psychonauts who are interested in the maps of inner space provided by buddhism explores the use of psychedelics in buddhist practice sharing the kind of spiritual experiences that can be gained with each describes meditation techniques with special attention being given to the generation of the four positive attitudes in this user s guide to psychedelic buddhism lama mike crowley presents techniques for buddhists who wish to incorporate psychedelics into their practice as well as for psychonauts who are interested in the maps of inner space provided by buddhism the author details how psychedelics have led to spontaneous awakening experiences such as indra s net and universal voidness that were once thought to be available only to advanced meditators he explores the use of psychedelics such as lsd and psilocybin mushrooms in a buddhist context sharing the kind of spiritual experiences and benefits that can be gained with each the author also looks at the use of psychedelics encoded in vedic and buddhist scriptures particularly in the vajrayāna tradition from the middle ages until

the present day presenting an informed summary of buddhism for psychonauts the author explores the key beliefs of buddhism the life of the buddha and the practices followed in various yanas or paths he describes meditation techniques with special attention being given to the generation of the four positive attitudes loving kindness compassion sympathetic joy and equanimity each being taken from their personal to their universal forms he looks at buddhist symbols ceremonies deities and initiations as well as psychic powers in buddhist tradition and how these ideas and practices can be used in the exploration of the inner realms of consciousness providing a complete guide to integrating psychedelics into buddhist practice this book reveals how the ancient buddhist teachers discovered their universal maps of consciousness and how you can use their wisdom to guide your journey

more than ever people are in pursuit of greater fulfillment in their lives seeking a deeper spiritual truth and strategies for liberation from suffering both buddhism and psychedelics are subjects that one encounters in such spiritual pursuit edited by tricycle contributing editor allan badiner and art edited by renowned visionary artist alex grey zig zag zen features a foreword by buddhist scholar stephen batchelor a preface by historian of religion huston smith and numerous essays interviews and art that lie outside the scope of mainstream anthologies this new edition of the classic work on buddhism and psychedelics includes a recent interview with rick doblin founder of maps contributions from ralph metzner james fadiman and kokyo henkel and a discussion of ayahuasca s unique influence on zen buddhism packed with enlightening entries offering eye opening insights into alternate methods of inner exploration

in the 1960s americans combined psychedelics with buddhist meditation to achieve direct experience through altered states of consciousness as some practitioners became more committed to buddhism they abandoned the use of psychedelics in favor of stricter mental discipline but others carried on with the experiment advancing a fascinating alchemy called psychedelic buddhism many think exploration with psychedelics in buddhism faded with the revolutionary spirit of the sixties but the underground practice has evolved into a brand of religiosity as eclectic and challenging as the era that created it altered states combines interviews with well known figures in american buddhism and psychedelic spirituality including lama surya das erik davis geoffrey shugen arnold sensei rick strassman and charles tart and personal stories of everyday practitioners to define a distinctly american religious phenomenon the nuanced perspective that emerges grounded in a detailed history of psychedelic religious experience adds critical depth to debates over the controlled use of psychedelics and drug induced mysticism the book also opens new paths of inquiry into such issues as re enchantment the limits of rationality the biochemical and psychosocial basis of altered states of consciousness and the nature of subjectivity

centering african diasporic traditions the margins of mainstream mystical traditions and the intersection between mysticism and psychedelics

the essays in this volume offer several diverse and unique contemporary approaches to the study of mysticism in a time when the word mystic or mysticism appears as often in popular and even scientific settings as it does in academic or religious discourse a critical study of these terms and traditions becomes ever more relevant this volume challenges normative notions of who counts as a mystic and questions the definitions and interpretive frames underlying the field of comparative mysticism itself this is an important text for students and scholars of comparative mysticism and those interested in what traditions texts communities rituals persons and practices have been marginalized in the development of what counts as mysticism today

why do people seek a connection to something beyond the social dimensions of the world ecstatic experiences are often labelled religious spiritual mystical or even sacred however ecstasy is not just extraordinary for many people throughout the world it is an ordinary part of daily life the handbook highlights the diverse individuals who have experienced ecstasy in the past and present from ordinary people to mystics pastors healers spirit mediums and urban neo therapeutic shamans chapters show that ecstasy may be experienced during trance possession prayer and even through the use of drugs such as soma peyote ayahuasca ibogaine mushrooms lsd and other substances while institutional expressions of religion may be on the decline experiences of religious ecstasy and interactions among living people and gods saints angels and demons individually and collectively are happening everywhere occurring at home online in the community and through prayer dance song possession and the ingestion of drugs ecstatic religious experience as this handbook shows provides meaning belonging and for some profit in the late capitalist marketplace

secret drugs of buddhism is the first book to explore the historical evidence for the use of entheogenic plants within the buddhist tradition drawing on scriptural sources botany pharmacology and religious iconography this book calls attention to the central role which psychedelics played in indian religions it traces their history from the mysterious soma potion celebrated in the most ancient hindu scriptures to amrita the sacramental drink of vajrayana buddhism although amrita used in modern vajrayana ceremonies lacks any psychoactivity there is copious evidence that the amrita used by the earliest vajrayana practitioners was a potent entheogen it is the nature of this psychedelic form of the sacrament which is the central topic of this book in particular secret drugs of buddhism attempts to identify the specific ingredients employed in amrita s earliest formulations to this end the book presents evidence from many countries in which the vajrayana movement flourished these include bhutan japan mongolia and tibet but special attention is given to india the land of its origin

exploring first hand the amazing potential of mushrooms mdma lsd and other life enhancing substances twenty years on from the bestselling success of buddhism for mothers sarah napthali remains keen to explore the depths of the human experience intrigued by reports of the

power of mushrooms mdma lsd ayahuasca and others and the immense potential for personal and spiritual growth she becomes determined to try these medicines and apply what she learns to the challenges she now faces as a newly divorced empty nester over one year sarah takes eight psychedelic medicines she navigates the highs of new romance and travel but also grapples with the loss of old friends and a confrontation with aching loneliness the psychedelic renaissance has provided a wealth of empirical evidence about the potential of these medicines but this is a first person account a chance to join someone on their trips and see how they impact her daily life

buddhism and psychedelic substances are historically connected in the united states the relationship between the practice and study of buddhism and the use of psychedelics is mutually beneficial in some cases yet their interaction can also create obstacles to optimum buddhist practice this dissertation utilizes a comparative analysis between two related domains tantric buddhism and ayahuasca shamanism to better understand how psychedelics may and may not be productively applied in buddhism and to ascertain what relevance psychedelics have for the continual development of buddhism in u s culture shamanism is of significant value when exploring this phenomenon because of its association with the spiritual use of psychedelic plants in ritualized settings toward positive results placing buddhism and psychedelics in their shamanic frameworks leads to tantric buddhism or what in certain contexts has been conceptualized as shamanic buddhism and forms of shamanism that use psychedelic plants in their practices such as ayahuasca shamanism a hermeneutic dialogue between tantric buddhism as exemplified by the nyingma school and ayahuasca shamanism as it arises in cross cultural vegetalismo with particular focus on the ritual practices as they are accessible in today s world by western practitioners facilitates insight into how tantric buddhism and ayahuasca shamanism can be usefully integrated which uncovers guidelines regarding steps to take to maximize the benefit and minimize the harm when using psychedelics to augment buddhist practice these procedures are related to the importance of preparation as well as the shamanic elements that are similar across tantric and ayahuasca rituals engaging this interplay can impact the development of psychedelic buddhism in the united states by beginning to formalize a more cautious and ritualized approach to the use of psychedelics in a buddhist context this research also suggests ways that a shamanic approach to psychedelic buddhism can inform the development of buddhism in the west more broadly

in these wide ranging essays erik davis explores the codes spiritual cultural and embodied that people use to escape the limitation of their lives and enrich their experience of the world these include asian religious traditions and west african trickster gods western occult and esoteric lore postmodern theory and psychedelic science as well as festival scenes such as burning man of which davis is the best known chronicler articles on media technology further explore themes davis took up in his acclaimed book techgnosis while his profiles of west coast poets musicians and mystics extend the california terrain he previously mapped in the visionary state whether his subject is collage art or the

magickal realism of horror writer h p lovecraft transvestite burmese spirit mediums or ufology tripster king terence mckenna or dub maestro lee perry davis writes with keen yet skeptical sympathy intellectual subtlety and wit and unbridled curiosity the common thread running through all these pieces is what davis calls modern esoterica which he describes in his preface as a no man s land located somewhere between anthropology and mystical pulp between the zendo and the metal club between cultural criticism and extraordinary experience whether psychedelic or yogic or technological such an ambiguous and startling landscape demands that the intrepid adventurer shed any territorial claims and go nomad davis wanders with sharp eyes and an open mind which is why peter lamborn wilson calls him the best of all guides to modern american spirituality

this is a different kind of book about psychedelics rather than describing psychedelic experiences it presents four future oriented ideas coming over the psychedelic horizon which illustrate the potential benefits of psychedelics for humanity stanislav grof s view of our minds as a way to understand works of art looking at disney s snow white the evidence that psychedelic occasioned mystical experiences can boost our immune systems psychedelics as a way of adding new cognitive programmes to our thinking skills applying the ideas from part 3 to learning

movement and postmodern eschatology in general terms and this is a rich complex study the work is a critique of modernization theory as a way of viewing history and suggests the modern epoch like the greco roman world before it will only end when the modern world ends accordingly many postmodern movements seek to end modernity through violent action germany and japan in ww11 etc while others seek to bring to an end modern consciousness e g the psychedelic movement which posed a major historical challenge to bourgeois morality values and modes of experiencing space and time the core of the study is a critique of the historical philosophy of japan s greatest modern philosopher nishida kitaro and in particular his historical eschatology cunningham examines the zen based metaphysics of nishida s thought and links this to historical resonances between the philosopher 20th c zen buddhism the west s leading theorist dt suzuki was a friend of nishida and the psychedelic new age movement which as sought to achieve authentic experience outside of history history and ideas series no 2 this work is a valuable addition to research library collections that focus on japan 20th alternative movements zen and or the philosophy of history dr elizabeth koda
